# The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

January 31, 1974

To the Honorable Senate and the House of Representatives:

I have the honor to submit herewith, in compliance with General Laws (Tercentenary Edition), Chapter 54, section 133, as amended, a report of the number of registered voters at the dates of the last city and town elections, and the total number of persons who voted at each such election in every city and town, and in every voting precinct therein, and the number of votes received by each candidate for nomination and for election for a state office in the year 1973, together with other information relating to elections.

# Returns under the "Corrupt Practices" Law

Since the last report special elections have been held to fill vacancies in the House of Representatives in the General Court: First Barnstable District (August 7, 1973), Twelfth Hampden District (October 23, 1973), and for Senator: Berkshire District (June 5, 1973), and Second Suffolk District (September 11, 1973).

In compliance with the General Laws (Tercentenary Edition), Chapter 55, as amended, nomination expense returns were received from twenty candidates in the above mentioned districts, two of whom reported no receipts, five reported no receipts or expenses. Total nomination receipts were \$33,819.43, expenditures \$40,081.12, liabilities \$8.674.59.

Election returns were received from seven candidates of whom four reported no receipts and liabilities. Total election receipts were reported as \$7,760.00, expenditures \$7,177.93 and liabilities, none.

Total receipts reported by candidates for both nomination and election were \$41,579.43, expenditures \$47,259.05, liabilities \$8,674.59.

Nomination expense returns were received from five treasurers of non elected political committees. The total amount reported was, receipts or contributions \$44,467.37, expenditures or disbursements \$41,743.39, liabilities \$5,001.45.

Election expense returns were received from four treasurers of non elected political committees. The total amount reported by the committee was \$32,940.66 receipts or contributions, \$33,314.32 expenditures or disbursements, \$64.60 liabilities.

Total receipts reported by treasurers of non elected political committees were \$77,408.03; expenditures or disbursements \$75,057.71, liabilities \$5,066.05.

Nomination expense returns were received from sixty-three treasurers of elected committees, of which sixty-one reported no receipts or disbursements. The total amounts reported by elected committees were, receipts or contributions \$28.00, expenditures or disbursements \$62.00, liabilities, none.

Election expense returns were received from fifty-nine treasurers of elected committees, of which forty-nine reported no receipts or disbursements. The total amounts reported by elected political committees were, receipts or contributions \$4,352.69, expenditures or disbursements \$3,409.51, liabilities, none.

Total receipts reported by treasurers of elected political committees were \$4,308.69, expenditures or disbursements \$3,471.51, liabilities, none.
