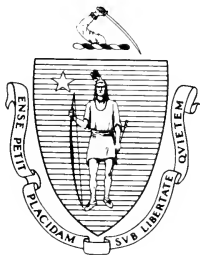

P. D. 43 — ELECTION STATISTICS FOR 1977

This booklet contains information about elections held in 1977. It lists the dates of the city and town elections, the number of people registered to vote in each precinct of each community, and the number of people who voted in the local election. It does not include the number of votes each candidate received.

In odd-numbered years like 1977, *Election Statistics* also provides detailed results of *special* state elections which were held to fill vacancies. This year there were nine of these elections.

This 1977 booklet also includes a list of mayors and city managers of the cities and a list of the kinds of elections held by each city and town in the Commonwealth. It does not include lists of city and town clerks and election commissioners and of selectmen, but these are available from the Elections Division. Names of other local officials are available from the local clerks.

P. D. 43 in even-numbered years is a larger volume, which gives the results of state primaries and elections for all candidates and questions on the ballot as well as information on local elections.
